Colorado Blue Spruce Tree:*

- Conifer.
- Green to light blue short needles stay on year round.
- Blue spruce trees can range from light green needles to pale blue and varies from tree to tree.
- Hardy tree but needs a drip.
- Small pinecones.
- Deer resistant.
- Great wind block & privacy trees.
- Up to 60' tall, spread of 25'.



Austrian Pine Tree:

- Conifer.
- Green med-sized needles stay on year round.
- Hardy tree but needs a drip.
- Small pinecones.
- Deer resistant.
- Up to 50' tall, 30' spread.



Ponderosa Pine Tree:

- Conifer.
- Long dark green needles with baseball sized pinecones.
- Sensitive to transplant & need a drip but once are established are extremely hardy trees.
- Needles stay on year round.
- Deer resistant.
- Up to 100'+, 3' trunks, 35'+ spread.
- State tree of Montana.



Lodgepole Pine Tree:

- Conifer.
- Medium light to green needles stay on year round.
- Small pinecones.
- Very Hardy tree.
- Up to 70' tall, 20' spread



Engalman Spruce Tree:

- "Soft" needles stay on year round.
- Dark green to light green in color.
- Small pinecones.
- Hardy but will need a drip to get established.
- Great wind block & privacy trees.
- Subalpine tree that is pyramidal in shape.
- Up to 60'-80' tall, 30' wide.



Dwarf Mugo Pine:

- Great hedge tree that is shapeable.
- Green needles stay on year round.
- Doesn't need a lot of trimming to keep a nice shape.
- Hardy tree.
- Tiny pinecones.
- 3' to 5' tall, eventually 6' to 10' wide.
